## PROFILE OF UNIVERSITY



**Sai Tirupati University** has been established by Government of Rajasthan, Jaipur vide its **Gazette Notification No F.2 (46)/Vidhi/2/2015 dated 21<sup>st</sup> April 2016 (Act No. 9 of 2016)** and has received approval from University Grant Commission (UGC) under section 2(f) of the UGC Act of 1956. This recognition allows the University to grant degrees and conduct research in various fields. Being UGC approved signifies that the University adheres to the standards set by the commission for higher education in India, ensuring quality education and academic integrity. The University aims to provide a diverse range of programs, fostering a conducive environment for learning and development, while also promoting research initiatives. As on date the University is successfully imparting Medical, Pharmacy, Nursing, Paramedical, Physiotherapy, MBA and Fashion & Technology in tribal

enriched belt of Rajasthan for last 8 years. MBBS course with intake of 150 students, MD/MS courses in 13 streams, M.Sc. (Non Clinical branches) in Biochemistry, Anatomy, Physiology, Pharmacology and Microbiology, B.Sc. (Nursing) M. Sc. (Nursing) Pharmacy and B. Pharmacy course, BPT and MPT course, Fashion Technology and Mass Communication imparting Diploma, Advance Diploma, UG and PG Courses in Design and Mass communication and MBA in Hospital Administration. University offers Ph. D in faculty of Medical Sciences (Non Clinical branches) and Faculty of Nursing as per the norms of UGC.

All courses being run by the University are approved by concerned regulatory bodies wherever applicable. The courses being run at the University are as per the Schedule II (Disciplines in which University shall undertake study and research) appended with the University Act and amendment.

Sai Tirupati University campus is spread over in 50.52 Acres of land at Village Umarda, Tehsil Girwa, District Udaipur, Rajasthan. The campus comprises of Medical College building as per the norms of NMC, Nursing College building as per the norms of INC, Pharmacy College building as per the norms of PCI and building for Physiotherapy College and Paramedical College Building according to their regulatory bodies. University campus has a 1140 bedded multispecialty hospital building covering specialties as Orthopedics, Obstetrics and Gynecology, Dermatology, Medicine, Surgery, Ophthalmology, Psychiatry, Radio Diagnosis, Respiratory Diseases, Oncology, Urology, Gastroenterology and Oto-Rhino-Laryngology etc. In addition, the campus has in-house hostel facilities for Boys and Girls along with residential quarters for teaching and non-teaching staff members and Guest House with all comforting facilities. Separate common facilities as Gymnasium, Laundry, Mess, Canteens, ATM, Cooperative and Medical Store, outdoor games, Parking etc.

All Colleges and Hospital buildings are well equipped with state of art modern Class rooms and Laboratories, Digital Library, Sophisticated Equipments, Common Rooms, Administrative Blocks and Amenities. All buildings are well ventilated. Hostel Buildings are well equipped with recreational activities facilities, Wi-Fi facility, safety measures, Indoor games facilities, Common area and meeting room. Roof top of buildings of the

University are provided with solar panels for in-house production of electricity. Proper sewage treatment plant has been installed and is operational in University campus for recirculation of waste water. Rain water harvesting system is operational in the campus.

Education and Training imparted to the students of the University are at par with the best institutes of Nation and University is committed to establish itself as a centre of excellence with contribution of Administrative, Teaching and Non-teaching staff. Facilities for practical training and internship of students of various courses of University are in-house available through 1140 bedded multi-specialty hospital attached with medical college and its Urban and Rural centre.




## LABORATORIES:

Sufficient numbers of laboratories as per the norms of concerned regulatory bodies of respective courses are available for Practical training of students studying at the University. Laboratories of all the constituent units of Sai Tirupati University and constituent multispecialty hospital are totally equipped with normal and sophisticated equipments for routine and advanced practical and investigations. Proper log books are maintained for investigations and practicals performed.

Laboratories are spacious, ventilated, provided with safety measures and are in position to overcome any untoward happening at any point of time. The constructions of all the laboratories are done in manner to maintain proper hygiene and disposal of hazardous chemicals. Proper trained personals are available in each Laboratory to maintain the equipments and to guide the students for performing practicals and carrying out investigations. Wherever required approvals of concerned authorities have been taken to run the sophisticated instruments eg. PCPNDT, AERB etc.





## HOSTEL, MESS AND RESIDENTIAL FACILITIES:-



Building blocks available at University Campus includes: Individual College buildings, Hospital Building, Boys Hostel Building, Girls Hostel Building, Residential quarters blocks and Laundry Block. Separate Boys and Girls hostels are provided in the University campus for UG and PG students. Luxury Flats for PG students are well maintained and equipped with all facilities. In addition, Residential quarters (1/2/3 BHK) are available in the University campus for accommodation of Teaching, Non-teaching and Administrative Staff members of the University. Guest house facility for parents of the students or other guests is also available with all modern amenities.

Each hostel room is well furnished with double bed, study table, wardrobes and has an attached bath and toilet, with 24 hours hot water supply. Each hostel has separate common

rooms with color television with DTH and facilities for indoor games where students can relax after exhaustive hours of study. The modern cafeteria of the campus provides hygienic and mouth-watering delicious snacks to the students. Special dishes are served on special occasions. All hostels are equipped with Wi Fi facility.



## TRANSPORTATION AND PARKING



University has its own in-house buses for transportation of students from all corners of the city. Separate luxury staff buses for transportation of staff members along with hired vehicles facility for senior faculty and administrative staff members are also available. Parking slots are available at different places viz. outside college and hospital building, each hostel building with proper demarcation. Separate slots for parking of heavy vehicles including University buses are made available. Parking facility for visitors with proper bifurcation of area is available.

Multiple Ambulance facility for transportation of patients are available having access to main entrance and emergency entrance of the Hospital. Ambulance are equipped with all amenities for primary care of patients.

Proper trained drivers and cleaners are available in all buses of the University. All road safety measures are being followed. Ambulance facility is provided with trained nursing staff.



**The Library** of any of the educational institute is the heart of the institute which act as a support to the University educational and research programs.




