1. Introduction

World AIDS Day is observed globally on 1st December every year to raise awareness about Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) and Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome (AIDS). The day emphasizes the importance of prevention, early diagnosis, timely treatment, and reduction of stigma and discrimination associated with HIV/AIDS. For medical students and healthcare professionals, World AIDS Day serves as an important reminder of their role in patient education, preventive counselling, and compassionate care.

To commemorate World AIDS Day 2025, the National Service Scheme (NSS) conducted hospital-based awareness activities aimed at patients and their attendants. The programme was implemented with the active involvement of NSS volunteers, interns, and medical social workers.

2. Objectives

- To sensitize NSS volunteers about HIV/AIDS
- To create awareness about HIV/AIDS among patients and their relatives
- To educate people regarding modes of transmission of HIV
- To promote preventive measures and safe practices
- To encourage early testing and timely treatment
- To dispel myths and misconceptions related to HIV/AIDS
- To reduce stigma and discrimination towards people living with HIV

3. Event Highlights

- Sensitization and Training of NSS Volunteers on HIV/AIDS:** NSS volunteers were first sensitized by Program Officer about HIV/AIDS and the theme for the year, "Take the Rights Path: My Health, My Right!".
- Exposure Visit and Learning Experience at ART Centre:** They were taken to ART centre at hospital building. As part of the programme, the students were taken to the ART (Antiretroviral Therapy) Centre, where they were oriented to the functioning of the centre, including patient registration, counseling services, drug dispensing, follow-up mechanisms, and record maintenance. The students were briefed about the comprehensive care provided to people living with HIV, with emphasis on adherence to antiretroviral therapy, confidentiality, and long-term management. The volunteers also interacted with patients attending the ART Centre, which helped them gain firsthand insight into the challenges faced by people living with HIV and reinforced the importance of empathy, stigma-free care, and patient-centered service delivery.
- Preparation of IEC materials:** The volunteers were divided into groups and guided to prepare informative charts and slogan-based placards focusing on key aspects of HIV/AIDS.
- Hospital-Based Awareness Activities for Patients and Attendants:** They were then assigned to six clinical departments—Paediatrics, Obstetrics & Gynaecology, Dermatology, Respiratory Medicine, Psychiatry, and General Medicine, where they conducted awareness sessions for



patients and their attendants in the waiting areas of the respective departments. The awareness sessions covered topics such as the defining AIDS, modes of transmission, the importance of early diagnosis and available treatment options, and the role of prevention as a key strategy. Emphasis was placed on promoting safe sexual practices and addressing common myths and misconceptions related to HIV/AIDS, with the aim of reducing stigma and discrimination.

In addition, health-care workers at Laboratory were sensitized regarding safe handling of blood and body fluid samples, needle-stick injury prevention, post-exposure prophylaxis and importance of confidentiality. Special emphasis was given to antenatal HIV screening and prevention of parent-to-child transmission (PPTCT) during interactions with patients attending the Obstetrics and Gynaecology outpatient department. Furthermore, the dual burden of HIV-TB co-infection was specifically addressed in the Department of Respiratory Medicine, highlighting the importance of early diagnosis, integrated management, and treatment adherence. The sessions were interactive in nature, allowing patients and their attendants to actively participate, ask questions, and clarify doubts in a supportive and non-judgmental environment.

4. Key Outcomes

- Improved awareness regarding HIV/AIDS and functioning of ART centre among NSS volunteers
- Enhanced understanding of preventive measures and early diagnosis by patients and their attendants
- Reduction in myths and misconceptions related to HIV infection
- Development of communication and health education skills among NSS volunteers
- Promotion of a positive and non-discriminatory attitude towards people living with HIV

5. Conclusion

The observance of World AIDS Day 2025 by the Department of Community Medicine, PIMS Umarda, was carried out by NSS volunteers with the objective of promoting awareness on HIV/AIDS and reinforcing the principles of health, dignity, and human rights. Through structured sensitization and training, the volunteers were equipped to disseminate accurate information and address stigma related to HIV/AIDS. The hospital-based awareness activities conducted by the NSS volunteers for patients and their attendants facilitated community engagement and contributed to meaningful learning, reflecting the spirit of social responsibility and service integral to the National Service Scheme.

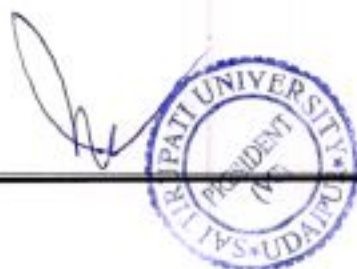

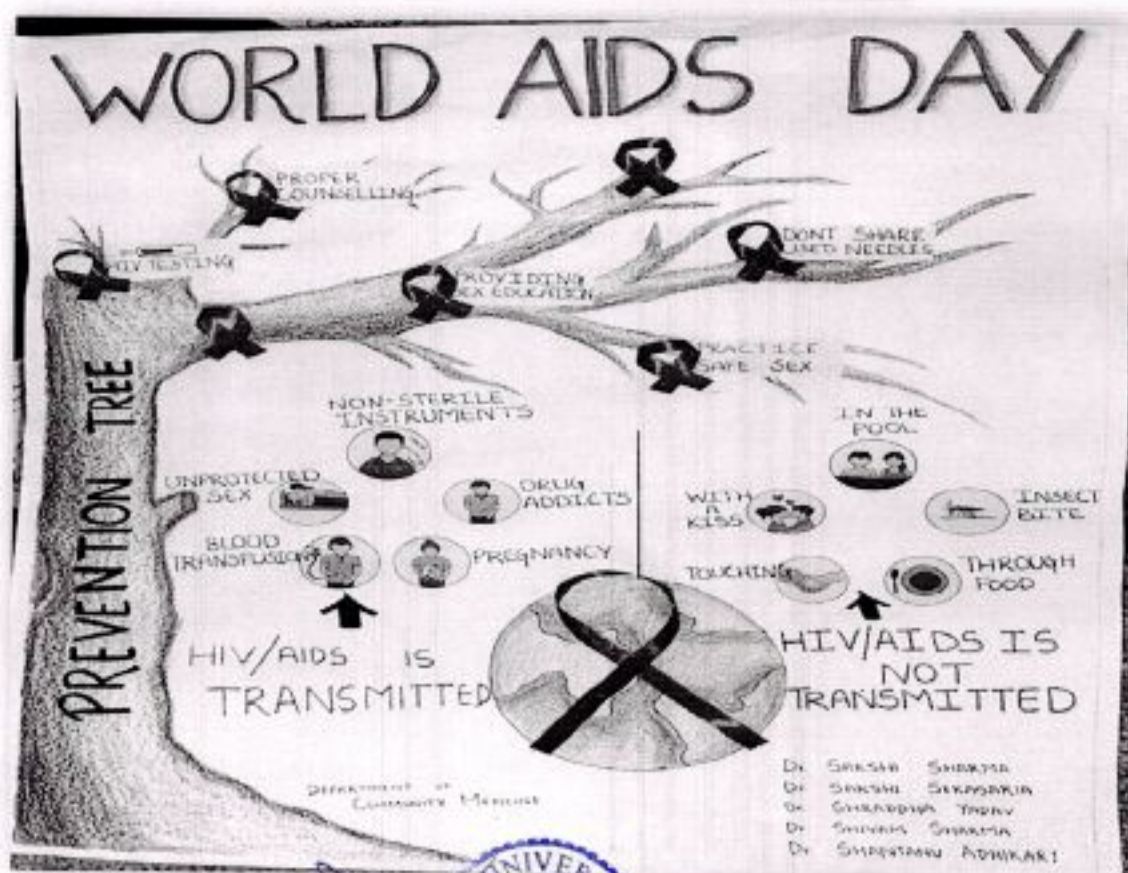
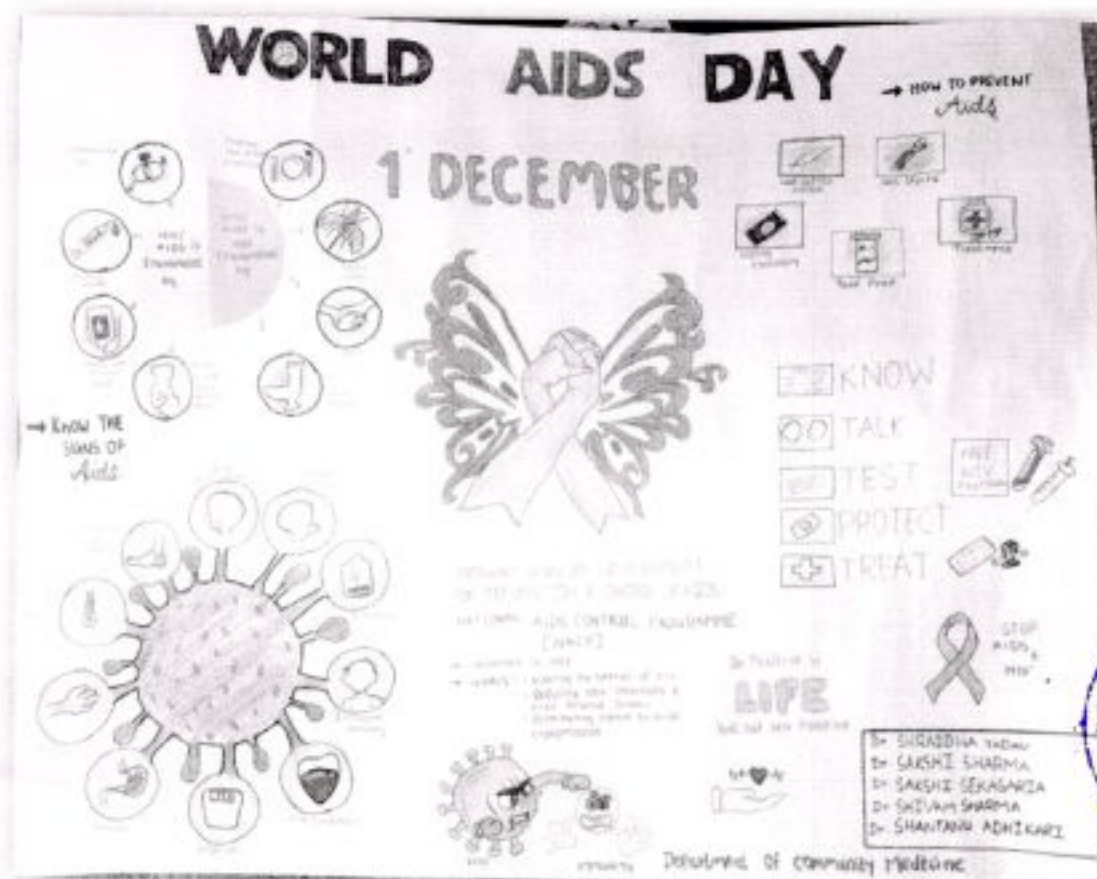
